

<u>The Summer Show</u> is Craft Scotland's annual selling exhibition showcasing the work of over 40 designer/makers from across Scotland. Running for three weeks as part of the <u>Edinburgh Festival Fringe</u>, it gives locals and visitors to the capital the opportunity to see and buy high-quality, original, contemporary craft.

The Summer Show presents a valuable opportunity for makers, introducing their work to a wider audience in a showcase which has been selected by industry experts; Gillian Scott (Director, Craft Design House) and Mhari McMullan (Director, Welcome Home), alongside Craft Scotland's Allyson Gee (Project Officer).

Held on the entire second floor of White Stuff on George Street, Edinburgh, the Summer Show attracts over 5,000 visitors. Now in its seventh year, the Summer Show also hosts a vibrant programme of hands-on, maker-led workshops for adults and young people.

The Summer Show is open to the public from Friday 2 August to Sunday 25 August 2019, with an invitation-only Private View held on Thursday 1 August 2019.

The role

Craft Scotland is looking for two individuals with retail experience to supervise the Summer Show. This is an ideal opportunity for those who wish to utilise their existing customer service skills in a creative festival environment.

You'll be surrounded by exquisite pieces of craft and get the opportunity to meet talented makers. Excellent communication skills, and an ability to work effectively as part of a small team are all essential for this role.

The successful candidates will be required to work either 10 or 20 days. Craft Scotland will ask for your availability and a rota will be confirmed in advance of the show. The post will complement the existing Craft Scotland team.




The successful candidates will ideally have an interest in the craft sector and have supervisor and retail experience. Training will be provided on the work for sale, the makers and craft in Scotland. Training will also be provided on how to operate a manual wheelchair <u>stairclimber</u> and provide assistance to wheelchair users or those with reduced mobility.

Key accountabilities/deliverables

- Providing a friendly, professional and warm welcome to show visitors
- Assisting with set-up and take-down of the show
- Receiving and checking deliveries and ensuring that stock is well maintained and securely stored
- Assisting at the Private View opening
- If required, operating the manual <u>stairclimber</u> and providing assistance to wheelchair users or those with reduced mobility (training will be provided on Wednesday 24 July 2019)
- Developing and maintaining a thorough knowledge of the makers and items in the show
- Dealing with enquiries and providing information about the works on display, the makers, workshops and craft in Scotland
- Answering queries from customers
- Taking sales and processing card and cash payments
- Dealing with cashing up, including payment reconciliation and day-end reports
- Contributing to the achievement of sales targets by actively promoting workshop tickets and items for sale in the show
- Reporting any discrepancies or problems to Craft Scotland staff
- Ensuring the show is well presented at all times
- Coordinating control of stock, replenishing items in the show as required
- Maintaining the standards of merchandising, display and housekeeping required
- Carrying out surveys with visitors
- Encouraging visitors to sign up to the Craft Scotland newsletter
- Ensuring the security of cash, stock, equipment and property within the show area
- Assisting in workshop set up, including preparation of seating and distribution of prepared materials, if required
- Welcoming workshop participants and directing to the workshop area
- Be committed to health and safety and ensure familiarity with health and safety policies and procedures
- Promote equality and diversity in all aspects of your work by developing and maintaining
 positive working relationships, ensuring that colleagues and customers are treated fairly and
 with respect/dignity

Access

The Summer Show is held on the second floor of White Stuff, this is accessed via two flights of stairs. To access the second floor by lift visitors must request a member of staff to accompany them in the lift to the second floor, from there, there is a small flight steps to reach the Summer Show.

Please note, for wheelchair users or those with reduced mobility a manual <u>stairclimber</u> will be available. This does not accommodate visitors' wheelchairs but will accommodate those who can transfer to the stairclimber. A Summer Show supervisor will be responsible for operating the stairclimber and providing assistance. The Summer Show second floor space is fully accessible throughout.

Visitors can call Craft Scotland on 0131 466 3870 for further information or to discuss their requirements. Pushchairs can be left and the bottom of the second floor steps or alternatively can be carried up the steps.

We welcome assistance dogs and a bowl of water can be provided if requested. Large format labels and magnifying glasses are available on request.
